Fly-past by Battle of Britain Memorial Flight

## RAF INGHAM – THEN AND NOW



RAF Ingham, in Lincolnshire, was opened as an operational base in May 1942 with the arrival of the Polish 300, Land of Mazowia, Squadron, flying the Vickers Wellington Mk IV bomber from its grass runways. With only a short break, 300 Squadron was at Ingham until March 1944, when it was re-equipped and transferred to RAF Faldingworth, where the concrete runways were better able to cope with the weight of fully armed Lancasters. The last operational mission of 300 Squadron was on 8<sup>th</sup> May 1945 – fittingly as part of a major raid on Hitler's 'Eagle's Nest' at Berchtesgaden.

Polish 305, Land of Wielkopolska, Squadron also served at Ingham, although for a shorter period, as did RAF 199 Squadron. Airmen from Poland, Britain, Canada and Australia all served at Ingham during its brief war-time existence.

After the war, a Polish Resettlement Unit was built close to the village of Ingham, providing accommodation in family Nissen Huts for Poles unable to return home since the country whose freedom they had fought for, was now under the control of the same Stalin who had invaded it in September 1939.

In 2010 the RAF Ingham Heritage Group was founded by Geoff Burton. Its aim is to restore surviving airfield buildings – including an original Polish

Resettlement Unit family Nissen hut reconstructed on site - as a heritage centre commemorating the Polish, Canadian, Australian and British crews who lived, flew and died from the airfield. It serves also as the commemorative home of all four Polish Bomber Squadrons. With the support of the landowner, the Polish Air Force Association Charitable Trust, the Polish Ex-Combatants Association, and the Heritage Lottery Fund the Heritage Centre should be open by the end of next year.

The first priority, however, was to create a memorial to all those who died flying from RAF Ingham. This was unveiled on 26 May 2016 by Mr Witold Sobków, Ambassador of the Republic of Poland, with a fly-past by an RAF Typhoon.





The silhouette of a Wellington crew on the front cover of this booklet forms part of the memorial. It is visible from the road and will remind generations to come of the men who flew from this airfield and the sacrifices they made:
